Venturing

Dear Venturing Crew Advisors,

It seemed so far away, back in September at the Fall Fun Rally, when we first started discussing a push to recruit Venturers in February, but we are finally there. As we've been discussing, we are going to conduct an outreach to 8th graders in our sponsoring institutions because most 8th graders have now met the requirements to join Venturing or are within 90 days of meeting them.

The program is going to work similarly to the School Night to Join Scouting program to recruit new Cub Scouts at the start of every school year. Each Crew Advisor and Committee will work closely with Josh and Suzie to coordinate a time and date with your sponsoring institution where they can give brief presentations to 8th grade classes or setup an information booth at our larger middle schools or high schools during lunch periods.

The key obligation, on the part of your crew, is that there be plan in place, with an open house, some sort of affordable (no-cost or low-cost) event for the prospect to attend and a commitment to follow-up to ultimately get the teen to join.

The hope is to make this an annual program to strengthen all of the existing crews in the district with a yearly influx of new members. You've heard it said at our meetings, "if you're not recruiting, you're dying". Just imagine if your crew was able to recruit two new Venturers from this program for each of the next 3 years, your crew would have 6 additional teens.

Who wouldn't love to have 6 more members right now?
