Upcoming Training Dates:

May 6 & 7 2017

Adult Leader Training Outdoor Skills at Beaumont for Scoutmasters and Asst Scoutmasters.

NYLT National Youth Leadership Training:

Why Should you send your Scouts to NYLT?

Through this weeklong outdoor training, male and female Scouts grow and improve their leadership skills while following the guidelines of the Scout Oath and Scout Law. NYLT is conducted during summer camp.

Scouts earning the NYLT shield are better prepared to interact with adult leaders and face the challenges and demands ahead.

Boy Scouts:

Requirements to attend NYLT, a Scout must be:

- A current registered member of the BSA who has attended long- term Boy Scout camp for a minimum of two years.
- First Class rank of higher.
- Twelve years old.
- A member of a troop whose Scoutmaster has completed the adult Boy Scout Leader Basic Training Course.
- A current or prospective your leader approved by the Scoutmaster.

Venturing:

Requirements to attend NYLT:

Must meet all of the above but the First Class requirement.

A Scout need only attend one of the weeks to successfully complete the NYLT course. The Scout must be at camp for the entire week to complete the program.

NYLT Course options: (Both options are offered each week)

- Land based
- Pack and Paddle

Land Based:

The land based course is hosted at S-F Scout Ranch. Scouts will learn leadership skills, while improving their camping, fire building, cooking and time management skills.

Pack and Paddle:

The Pack and Paddle course is conducted at the S-F Scout Ranch backcountry on Nims Lake. Scouts will learn the same leadership skills offered at the land based camp plus, practice low-impact camping, hiking, canoeing and learn the proper use of a compass for navigation.

Memorial Day Good Turn

This is a reminder about the GSLAC Memorial Day Good Turn Event

As usual, the annual Memorial Day Good Turn is well represented by Gravois Trail Scouts and Venturers. St Louis and Southern Illinois communities get to see the character of our Scouts.

For more than six decades, approximately 4,000 Scouts have gathered at Jefferson Barracks National Cemetery prior to Memorial Day to decorate each of the 190,000 graves with an American Flag. The tradition, entering its 68th year, is one of the longest running Memorial Day events within the Boy Scouts of America.

Scouts honor those who served our country by raising the American Flag and then lowering it to half-mast as Scout buglers play "Taps." Scouts who earned the rank of Eagle Scout- the highest rank in Scouting- during the past year serve as the color guard. Scouts and leaders then decorate each grave in the cemetery with a small American Flag.

It takes just two hours for Scouts to place more than 280,000 flags, which are provided by the cemetery.

In 1866, Jefferson Barracks was established as a national cemetery and today is one of the oldest interment sites of the National Cemetery Administration, Department of Veterans Affairs.

Incentives

- Send two Scouts more than in 2016 and receive \$25 off per scout.

Pack & Paddle

The Pack & Paddle course is conducted in the S bar F Scout Ranch backcountry and on Nims Lake during the NYLT courses. Attending Scouts develop leadership skills, practice low-impact camping, hiking, canoeing and learn the proper use of a compass for navigation.

All participants must stow food, crew gear, shelter, personal items and any other essential equipment in their packs. It's important to remember, that when selecting equipment, this is a physically demanding course.

Pack & Paddle requirements

- Meet all NYLT requirements
- Be 14 years of age by date of summer camp
- Pass the BSA swim test (swim 100 yards using strong strokes)
