- A nominee should have contributed some service to youth outside of Scouting. Consideration should be given to a nominee's position and the corresponding opportunity to render outstanding service beyond the expectation of duty.
- A nominee's attitude toward, and cooperation with, the district and council is to be taken into consideration.

Eagle Scout Project Report and Board of Review



Scouts presenting their Eagle Project Workbook for a District Review, or presenting their Eaglecredentials for a Council Board of Review, must present the originals of all of the required documents.

In each case, the Scout should bring three copies of all of the documents so the reviewers do not have to take turns reading the documents.

Scouts should NOT present the review teams with a thumb drive containing all of the required documents, for several reasons:

- The review teams do not have computers/laptops etc. during the review sessions
- Most reviewers would not willingly insert an unknown USB into their computer even if they had it during a review
- It is really, really difficult for three or more reviewers to sign a thumb drive. ..

Eagle Palm Requirements Change

Effective August 1, 2017 the requirements for earning Eagle Palms have changed. The new requirements are:

After successfully completing your Eagle Scout Board of review and being validated as an Eagle Scout by the National Service Center, you will be entitled to receive an Eagle Palm for each additional five merit badges you have completed before your Eagle Scout board of review. For these Palms only, it will not be necessary for you to complete any of the requirements stated below.

- 1. Be active in the Boy Scouts of America for at least three month after becoming an Eagle Scout or after the last Palm was earned. **
- 2. Since earning the Eagle Scout rank or your last Eagle Palm, demonstrate Scout spirit by living the Scout Oath and Scout Law. Tell how you have done your duty to God and how you have lived the Scout Oath and Scout Law in your everyday life.
- 3. Continue to set a satisfactory example of accepting responsibility or demonstrating leadership activity.
- 4. Earn five additional merit badges beyond those required for Eagle or last Palm. ***
- 5. While an Eagle Scout, participate in a Scoutmaster conference.
 - ** Eagle Palms must be earned in sequence, and the three-month tenure requirement must be observed for each Palm.
 - *** Merit badges earned any time since becoming a Boy Scout may be used to meet this requirement.

Eagle Scouts should receive any Palms earned prior to their Eagle Scout board of review when they receive their Eagle medal.

The requirement for a Board of Review for Eagle Palms has been eliminated.

The Bronze Palm represents the first five merit badges beyond the 21 required for Eagle. The Gold Palm represents the next five (ten total). The Silver Palm represents the next five (fifteen total).

Palms can be worn on the Eagle Scout square knot by adults, on the ribbon of the Eagle Scout medal, or on the Eagle Scout rank patch on the youth field uniform.
