The Scout is able to ask questions and get ready to embark on an exciting time in his Scouting career. If you have any

Interested in Being An Eagle Presenter:

Have you ever thought about the rewarding task of performing Eagle Ceremonies? There will be an Eagle Presenter Seminar held on May 19th at 7:00 p.m. and May 22 at 7:00 p.m. You only need to participate in one of the two. After you finish the seminar your name will be placed on a Gravois Trail Eagle Presenter list which will be given to the Eagle Scout after his successful completion of his Eagle Board of Review. Life to Eagle Tip for May:

Wearing the uniform - or Neat in Appearance - It is preferred a Scout be in full field uniform for any board of review. As much of the uniform as the Scout owns should be worn, and it should be as correct as possible, with the badges worn properly. It may be the uniform as typically worn by the Scout's troop, crew, or ship. If wearing all or part of the uniform is impractical for whatever reason, the candidate should be clean and neat in appearance and dressed appropriately, according to the Scout's means, for the milestone marked by the occasion.

Board of Review Tip for May:

A Scout who has completed the requirements for any rank (except Scout rank) then appears before a board of review. It's purpose is to determine the quality of the Scout's experience and decide whether the requirements for the rank has been fulfilled. If so the board not only approves the Scout's advancement but also provides encouragement to continue the quest for the next rank. Because the board of review date becomes the effective advancement date, boards should be scheduled promptly as scouts are ready, or set up on a regular basis that assures Scouts are not delayed in beginning time-oriented requirements for the next rank.

Note that Scouts must be registered through the time they are working on advancement requirements.





Memorial Day Good Turn

Scouts of all ages are invited to participate in the 2019 Memorial Day Good Turn on Sunday, May 26. Check-in for Jefferson Barracks Good Turn, hosted by the Gravois Trail District, runs from 11:30 a.m.-12:15 p.m. *in front of Beasley Elementary School at the south side of the cemetery*. The procession from Beasley Elementary to the cemetery will begin at 12:30 p.m. Upon check-in, the unit leader will receive a unit participation ribbon. A Memorial Day Good Turn patch will be available for \$4; segment patch is \$1.

Here's some important information to know before you go:

- Plan for a hike. You will be walking 2-3 miles on the day of the event.
- The person who registers the unit should be your main contact person for the event.
- Please do not bring Unit or American Flags.
- No Parking will be allowed on the Cemetery Grounds. Plan on Parking in Sylvan Springs County Park on Sheridan Rd.
- Scouts and Scouters should be in uniform.
- Check the forecast before you head out. Bring rain gear, if necessary. The event is held rain or shine.
- Make sure you bring plenty of water for you and your Scouts. It's also a good idea to bring hats and sunscreen.
- Damaged Flags should not be placed on a site. Instead please return damaged flags to a flag box.

Remember the Scout Law and the purpose of the day. We are guests at Beasley Elementary and Jefferson Barracks Cemetery.
