By Max Thorne National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT)

NYLT is a week-long outdoor leadership training program for youth leaders developed by the Boy Scouts of America. A highly trained youth staff under the supervision of adult advisors set the example in modeling the core learning and leadership messages. The course focuses on teaching leadership skills through the patrol or crew method which they can use in their home units, churches, schools, and just everyday life. The participants will be challenged to accomplish activities and projects using the leadership skills taught in the course. Participants will experience the simulation of a month in the life of a Scouting unit, complete with meetings, activities, and planning for the big monthly outing.

To attend NYLT, a Scout must be:

- A current registered member of the BSA
- First Class rank or higher and completed introduction to Leadership Skills for Troops
- 13 years old
- A current or prospective youth leader **<u>approved</u>** by the Scoutmaster or Crew Advisor
- Venturers and Sea Scouts are exempt from the first class rank and must fall within the maximum age allowance and minimum age for Venturers.
- Pack & Paddle candidates must be 14 years old by the date of camp and pass the BSA Swim test.

NYLT is intended to strengthen the relationship between the youth leader and unit leader. The unit leader is highly encouraged to have a pre-course and post-course conference with the participant to discuss their vision and goals for future success of their home unit. Plus the Scoutmaster/Crew Leader (or their designee) is invited down to help cook and serve Saturday lunch to our Youth Leaders.

Do you have youth that have been through the program and looking for more? Talk to them about considering being part of a NYLT staff. We still have available positions.

First, I want to thank my predecessor, Mark Wilbur, for his distinctive service as Camping Chair. Thank you, Mark!


